- II. **Reading** – максимальное количество баллов 15. Каждый правильный ответ оценивается в 1 балл. За неверный ответ или отсутствие ответа выставляется 0 баллов.
- III. **Use of English** – максимальное количество баллов 10. Каждый правильный ответ оценивается в 1 балл. За неверный ответ или отсутствие ответа выставляется 0 баллов.
- IV. **Writing** – максимальное количество баллов 10.

В вопросах 14-19 и 35-44 учитывается орфография. При наличии орфографической ошибки балл не начисляется.

Teen Magazines

- A.** **Youth World** is an entertainment magazine full of ideas on what to do. It provides details of all the latest films, concerts, exhibitions and fashion shows. If you are someone who prefers to stay in, it also recommends the best DVDs to watch.

As well as articles about the natural world, the magazine also has many special offers and competitions.

It also offers a variety of reviews on recent books, films and music CDs.

The Plastic Problem: A Community Fights Back

In the small coastal town of Seaview, residents noticed something worrying. Every time it rained, plastic bottles, bags, and packaging would wash up on their beautiful beach. The town council decided it was time to take action.

First, they organized a community beach clean-up day. Over 200 volunteers showed up with gloves and bags. In just three hours, they collected more than 500 kg of rubbish. But they knew this was only a temporary solution.

Next, the council started an education campaign in local schools. Children learned about how long plastic lasts in the environment and how it affects sea life. The students then created posters and talked to their families about reducing plastic use.

The most effective change came when local shops agreed to stop providing free plastic bags. Instead, they sold reusable cloth bags at a low price. Many cafes also started offering discounts to customers who brought their own cups.

Within a year, the amount of plastic waste on Seaview beach had reduced by 60%. The community learned that when people work together, they can make a real difference to the environment.
